Liam graduated from the University of Bristol with an MSci in Chemistry in 2009. He remained at Bristol to study gold-catalysed oxidative arylation during his PhD (2009-2013) under the supervision of Dr Chris Russell and Professor Guy Lloyd-Jones FRS FRSE. Liam then moved with the Lloyd-Jones group to Edinburgh to conduct post-doctoral research into supported reagents for use in palladium catalysis. In 2015, Liam was appointed an assistant professor of organic chemistry at the University of Nottingham. His research interests concern the development and mechanistic interrogation of new methods in synthesis and catalysis.
